Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta Teams Up with ARC for Elderly Care

Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta and the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) have been approved as the newest SOURCE (Service Options Using Resources in a Community Environment) Enhanced Primary Care Management Providers. This is the first time that Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta and ARC have participated

in the SOURCE Program that uses primary care physicians at the helm of the case management model. The partnership has been approved by the Georgia Department of Community Health.

ARC and Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta have enjoyed a similar partnership in providing care management for

Georgia's Community Care Services Program (CCSP), Georgia's oldest and largest Medicaid waiver program.

SOURCE is an enhanced primary care case management program serving frail elders and adults with disabilities. It is designed to delay or prevent the need for hospital and nursing home admissions by integrating primary medical care with supportive home care services.

The Andrew and Eula Carlos Hospice Atlanta Center Celebrates 10 Years

After 58 years of service, the Atlanta community has come to depend upon Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta as it would a valued and trusted friend. With Atlanta's 65-and-older population growing faster than any other major city in the country – exploding to over 900,000 individuals by 2030 – the community's expectations of Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta and the need for its home health, hospice and geriatric care management services are growing as well.

When the Hospice Atlanta Center opened its doors 10 years ago, we occupied a unique place in the community as the only nonprofit hospice center in the metro Atlanta area.

With 36 rooms, the Hospice Atlanta Center is and will always be the largest residential hospice in Georgia. By all standards of measurement, it is one of Georgia's finest in-patient hospice facilities. Today, our nonprofit status, community partnerships and scope of services mean that we continue to be differentiated in a marketplace that is now crowded with competition, mostly from multi-state chains.

Today, there are about 40 providers of hospice care in Atlanta. Most operate on a for-profit basis and selectively pick the most profitable patients with the fewest medical complications. Because of our commitment to serve patients regardless of age, diagnosis or income level, we are often a hospice provider of last resort. That doesn't affect our mission to provide compassionate care of the highest quality, but it does present financial challenges.

Hospice care delivered by Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta includes an interdisciplinary team of over 250 nurses, aides, social workers, trained volunteers and chaplains who work with patients' primary care physicians and families to ensure patients are cared for compassionately and comfortably in life's final journey. Our team provides for physical, emotional and spiritual needs and helps patients live their last days on their own terms, with their wishes respected, their decisions enforced and their dignity assured.

A gap often exists between the actual costs of specialized hospice services delivered and the amount of reimbursement from payer sources such as Medicare, Medicaid and commercial insurers. For these patients and their families, we count on community support.

As we celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the Hospice Atlanta Center, we are celebrating more than the bricks and mortar that house our program; we are marking an important milestone that celebrates our ability to provide the highest level of care possible in an often challenging financial and competitive climate. That's the real accomplishment.

Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta Teams Up with ARC for Elderly Care

With the primary care physician as the lead for the care management team, the goal is to coordinate medical care, chronic care and daily activity care, provided through the long-term care network, for better overall outcomes.

“At Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta we are committed to serving the community’s health needs in every way possible. The SOURCE program dovetails perfectly with the services we provide.

We are delighted to partner with the ARC’s Area Agency on Aging once again to serve the frail elderly and disabled, with their primary care physicians, to improve health outcomes,” says Mark Oshnock, President and CEO, Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta.

Cathie Berger, chief of ARC’s Aging Services Division, echoed Oshnock’s comment. “As the Area Agency on Aging, ARC is committed to helping older adults remain in the community. Our experienced intake and screening counselors are perfect partners with Visiting Nurse’s case management professionals to serve clients who qualify for the SOURCE program.”

Catherine Ivy, Director of the Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta Older Adult Services division, will direct the organization’s participation in the SOURCE program. “We are looking forward to expanding our capabilities in the area of chronic disease management through participating in Georgia’s SOURCE Program,” Ivy says.

Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta is a community-based organization dedicated to delivering compassionate, innova-

tive and cost-effective home health and end-of-life care to residents of 26 north Georgia counties. The organization is Georgia’s largest nonprofit homecare and hospice provider,

serving over 15,000 patients annually with 500 employees. According to Medicare statistics, Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta has one of the lowest rates of hospital readmission for patients in Georgia, a key indicator of quality care; Visiting Nurse | Hospice

Atlanta rates are 21%, compared with the state average of 29%. The organization is a United Way agency.

The Atlanta Regional Commission is the official planning agency for the 10-county Atlanta Region, including Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry and Rockdale counties as well as the City of Atlanta and 62 other cities. As the Area Agency on Aging, ARC plans and coordinates services for older adults in the region and seeks ways to improve the quality of life, health status and independence of the region’s seniors.

Service Options Using Resources in a Community Environment (SOURCE) builds on the state’s primary care case management program, Georgia Better Health Care Program (GBHC). The Division of Medical Assistance in the Department of Community Health administers SOURCE to approximately 6,900 elderly and disabled beneficiaries statewide. Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta will practice to the goals of SOURCE which include preventing premature institutionalization of disabled and frail elderly and reducing acute care costs related to hospitalization and the unnecessary use of emergency services.



Touching Lives

HOSPICE BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT

Hospice Atlanta's efforts to provide compassionate care don't stop at the bedside, or even in the first days and weeks of bereavement. In fact, Bereavement Coordinator Sharon Scott (Scottie to her Hospice friends) says that her secret is understanding that families probably need her most at the three month mark.

"After about three months, family and community support begins to wane, but the real grieving process is just beginning," says Scottie. "Once the estate is settled and the rest of the world expects that you are probably healing, the shock of the loss is just beginning to be felt." It's at this point that it is critical to reach out to an experienced bereavement support person, or join a support group, explains Scottie. This is where Hospice Atlanta comes in.

Scottie first joined Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta as a social worker in 1983 and has served as the Bereavement Coordinator since 1985. One of her primary functions is family bereavement support, which Hospice offers to families for up to one year after a patient dies; two years if the family has lost a child. Scottie recognizes that her efforts can make a huge difference to people who need an outlet for their feelings, even if all they need is to talk. "It's important for people to know they have someone to talk to who will listen to them," she says. "People grieve in different ways and for different lengths of time. They need to be able to express that."

Along with being a good listener with a sympathetic and knowledgeable ear, Scottie is armed with information about

the grieving process that helps people realize that what they are experiencing is completely normal. "Often those grieving feel as though they are alone in their feelings, and it helps to realize that what they are feeling is OK," explains Scottie. Whether or not their loved one has died at the Hospice Atlanta Center, Scottie is available to provide support and counsel, and often refers out of town family members to the

hospice center in their home community.

Hospice Atlanta also has one of the oldest bereavement support groups in Atlanta, which is offered the second and fourth Sundays of every month from 2 to 3:30 p.m. at the Hospice Atlanta Center. The meetings are open to any adult who has suffered a loss, not just the families of Hospice Atlanta patients.

Helping young people deal with the death of a loved one is another part of the Hospice

Atlanta bereavement program. Each November, Visiting Nurse | Hospice Atlanta sponsors Camp STARS at Camp Twin Lakes in Rutledge, Ga., east of Atlanta. The camp is for any young person, age 7 to 17, who has suffered the loss of a loved one, again, not only for Hospice Atlanta patient families. The weekend-long camp provides young people with group counseling and many activities that are both helpful in the healing process and are a lot of fun, too. East Meets West

Japanese Advocates Visit Hospice Atlanta Center for Information and Inspiration

Hospice Atlanta Center was honored recently to welcome Mr. Hiroyasu Itoh, Chairman of Japan Abilities, Inc., and CEO of Abilities Care-Net Inc. in Japan, for his second visit. Mr. Itoh is a Japanese businessman and a campaigner for disability rights, as well as a professor at Waseda University. Though hospice is not wide-

ly available in Japan, the idea of spending one's last days at home is appealing to many Japanese, so Mr. Itoh and a team of top level Japanese healthcare professionals from different areas of Japan visited the Hospice Atlanta Center to learn about end-of-life care.

Hospice Atlanta Center's management team talked with the group about the challenges and rewards of running a nonprofit hospice program. They described the differences between the home program and the services offered at the Center. Several of the visiting dignitaries were interested in knowing how Hospice Atlanta attracts clinicians when the

work could be described as depressing. Mary Arthur, VP of Operations, and Phil Kaufman, Director of Inpatient Hospice, both emphasized their belief that hospice work is a “mission” and a “calling” and that management's role is to create a good work environment. Barbara Moore, Manager of Volunteer Services, explained that

some nurses who leave the profession come back as volunteers, to complete their “calling.” Volunteering is not a concept that is well known or well understood in Japan, so the visitors found this especially interesting.

Their questions ran the gamut from insurance to spiritual care, from medications to the meaning of palliative care. They also discussed the continuum of care from home health to hospice and received a tour of the facility.

Hospice Atlanta Center is pleased to extend its hospitality and knowledge of the practical and philosophical aspects of hospice care to this very interested and engaged group.
